



PREPLANNED STRIKE COA SKETCH







Before any type of friendly IDF can be conducted BN FSCs will ensure airspace is clear. This will be accomplished by contacting the BDE FSC.

The BDE FSC will contact the Brigade Air Element, Air Liaison Officer and the UAS operator. Each element will go through their proper channels IOT ensure there are no assets in the air that may be affected by munitions fired by friendly forces.

Units will provide the BDE FSC with the firing unit location, max ordinance in feet of the weapon system firing and the target grid. If firing is necessary while assets are in the air airspace will then be de-conflicted at the BDE level.

Mission

By, with, and through our IA partners, 2/1 ID conducts counter IDF operations from 25AUG-TOA in AO BEAR in order to defeat AI Qaeda of Iraq (AQI), Defenders of Talatha (DOT), and Ashura Brigade (AB) IDF networks.

Commanders Intent:

Purpose: By with and through our IA partners, the Dagger Brigade will defeat the IDF networks operating in AO BEAR with the use of ISR, radars, Air Weapons Teams (AWT), Unmanned Arial Systems (UAS), Air Force assets, artillery and mortar fires. ISR, MASINT, and SIGINT will locate IDF teams, their weapons caches, and their paying agents. We will use AWT, UAS, Air Force Assets, artillery and mortar fires to engage IDF teams to allow the Dagger Brigade to move freely and to minimize casualties caused by IDF. Battalions will clear fires with the ISF through their partnered JOCs. **Key Tasks:**

Conduct CDE for all preplanned targets

End State: IDF teams in AO BEAR defeated, the Dagger BDE, 5th IA DIV, and 2nd IA DIV maintains freedom of maneuver in AO BEAR, casualties on FOBs minimized due to IDF, and no artillery or mortar fires are used within 250 meters of any structure (Building or road) to prevent civilian casualties.

Concept of the Operation:

Phase I (ISR, MASINT, and SIGINT focus) – Begins upon TOA and consists of the integration of ISR platforms, MASINT, and SIGINT to locate and track IDF Teams, their weapons caches, and the financiers paying them operating in AO BEAR. Phase I is complete upon transition to lethal engagement of IDF Teams.

Phase II (Lethal engagement of IDF Teams) – Execute lethal fires against IDF teams operating in AO BEAR using air to surface and surface to surface fires. Priority of execution is AWT, AF Assets, and Artillery Fires (21 FIB).

TASKS TO STAFF:

-Conduct cross boundary clearance of fires battle drills and clearance of fires battle drills to facilitate cross boundary fires (BN and BDE boundaries) and clearance of USF and ISF through partnered JOCs in AO BEAR.

FSCOORD Final Comments

- 1. Ensure your Counter Fire Battle Drills capture clearing ISF through your partnered JOC
- 2. Ensure preplanned precision targets have a strike packet sent to BDE for BDE CDR approval prior to them going to DIV for approval
- Mortars need to be meeting the 5 requirements for Accurate Predicted Fire to minimize collateral damage. (MET and Survey)
