Director's Message

Hello to the Army Reconnaissance and Long Range Surveillance Communities! I am the new Team Chief of the TRADOC Capabilities Manager-Reconnaissance team. I look forward to working with you all.

TCM-Recon remains fully engaged with development of the Organizational and Operational (O&O) Concept and R&S Capabilities Based Assessment (CBA).

The O&Os will be a four volume set; Vol. 1 – Cavalry Squadron, Vol. 2 – Cavalry Troop, Vol. 3 – Standard Scout Platoon, and Vol. 4 – Cavalry Squadron Headquarters and Headquarters Troop. Each with a base document providing the basic principles and a summary of the organizational design and operational employment of each echelon. Each O&O is supplemented with an O&O Concept Reference Document which provides detailed information on the organization design and operational employment of each echelon to support analysis, experimentation, and doctrine and training development. Volume 1 – the Cavalry Squadron is on track to be completed in December with the remaining three volumes completed in the January-February timeframe.

TCM-Recon's efforts in support of the Reconnaissance Capabilities Based Assessment (CBA) continue as we are finalizing the Functional Solutions Analysis (FSA) in December and forwarding for ARCIC Director's approval. Once approved, we'll post the entire CBA on the Reconnaissance Knowledge Network (RKN) site on MilSuite. The FSA is part of an Army and DoD process that provides recommended DOTMLPF solutions to the gaps, challenges or deficiencies identified in the Functional Needs Analysis (FNA) in our formations.

As we approach Christmas and New Year's, let me wish you all a very safe and enjoyable Holiday Season. This is a wonderful time of the year as several of us get to enjoy the time with families and friends. But we should never forget, this is a very stressful time for those Soldiers and Families that are separated as the mission never ends.



Improved Ghillie System

FORT BENNING, Ga. – The Soldier System Branch, Maneuver Center of Excellence, is working with Program Manager-Soldier Clothing & Individual Equipment (PM SCIE), Natick Soldier Research, Development & Engineering Center (NSRDEC) and the Army Capabilities Integration Center (ARCIC) to develop the Improved Ghillie System (IGS) to replace the Flame-Resistant (FR) Ghillie Suit, which no longer fits the Soldier desired requirement.

The IGS will provide improved counter-surveillance protection, comfort, improved protection from flame and thermal threats, increased mobility and agility, modularity and scalability, and increased integration properties for Soldiers. The base chassis recommended for wear with the IGS is the FR Army Combat Shirt (ACS) and the FR Army Combat Pant (ACP) which will provide an FR layer beneath the IGS. The ACS and ACP are not provided with this requirement.

FORT BENNING, Ga. – The 1st quarter, FY16 Cavalry Council, held on 4 November 2015, was the fourth meeting between the leaders of 3-16 Cavalry Squadron, 316 Cavalry Brigade, Maneuver Center of Excellence (MCoE) leaders and R&S leaders from the Combat Training Centers (CTCs) and the force. The Cavalry Council was facilitated by the 3-16 Cavalry Squadron. This meeting saw great participation from leaders across the installation and CTCs (see listed participants below). The council focused discussion on MCoE's R&S-Lethality Linkage initiative, updates from TCM-Recon and Cavalry Doctrine Branch, and discussions with leaders from NTC and JMRC Operations Group. The meeting provided a great venue to discuss topics of interest to the R&S community. The intent moving forward is to better leverage the venue to shape R&S initiatives, efforts, or POI here at MCoE based upon feedback and lessons learned and in-turn, shape areas of assessment and focus at the CTCs to support MCoE.


