B. The **Project Manager (PM) Stryker Brigade Combat Team (SBCT)**, Tankautomotive and Armaments Command (TACOM), informs of impacts to Garrison Contractor Logistics Support (CLS) as a result of the Army's budget situation. The current support contract with General Dynamics Land System (GDLS) which provides each of the brigades Field Support Representatives (FSRs), welder, scheduled service team, and unscheduled subject matter experts (SMEs) for the MGS and NBCRV platforms; ends on 28 February 2013. ABCTs will retain regional FSR to support their NBCRV platforms; however, after 28 FEB 2013 GDLS will no longer provide SME for the NBCRV platform, scheduled service support to include labor and parts, accident damage vehicle assessment support, or GDLS Welding support.

C. The AWfF team recently returned from Fort Carson, Colorado where we completed post rotation interviews with the leaders of **3**rd **ABCT**, **4 ID**. The Iron Brigade recently returned from an SFAB mission in Afghanistan. We are analyzing the information we collected from the brigade and will post a written report on HeavyNet in the near future. We congratulate the **Iron Brigade** for a job well done and wish all leaders and Soldiers the best of luck in all future endeavors.

Knox Award for best active duty battery; B Battery, 2nd BN, 218th FA, Oregon National Guard, winners of the Alexander Hamilton Award for most outstanding battery in the National Guard; and SFC Thomas Robinson from 1st BN, 377th FA (AA), 17th Fires Brigade, Joint Base Lewis-McCord, WA. for winning the Edmond L. Gruber award for his significant contributions to or the enhancement of the field artillery's warfighting capabilities, morale, readiness, and maintenance. 11) <u>Army Safety Net Update, 15 January 2013</u>, is published by the Army Safety Network and provides situational awareness to our community on issues such as risk management, explosive safety training, MRAP safety, and other significant safety issues, trends and updates.

13) Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Lessons Learned Newsletter, January 2013, informs readers about past and present crisis response efforts from Humanitarian Assistance/Disaster Relief (HA/DR) efforts that are well documented within observations, AAR, and Communities of Practice (COPs) by searching JLLIS. Another item of interest addressed includes DLA's support operations for the Afghanistan Drawdown and offers a JLLIS link that compiles lessons learned from past drawdown operations.

14) <u>Sustainment WfF Lessons Learned Newsletter, January 2013</u>, contains a cross section of sustainment-related documents: two safety alerts, both relating to improper ammunition storage and a newly released explosives handbook. Other items include the 593d Sustainment Brigade, also known as the CENTCOM Materiel Recovery Element; the 18th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion external SOP to assist units in preparing their property for retrograde disposition; and, the 401st Army Field Service Brigade's pocket guide to assist units with turning in retrograde equipment to the Redistribution Property Assistance Team (RPAT) yards.

15) The <u>ADA Lessons Learned Newsletter</u> is a quarterly publication of Lessons Learned through observation, insights, lessons (OIL), tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTP) to support unified land operations where appropriate. The purpose of this Newsletter is to provide the Fires Center of Excellence (FCoE) and the Air Defense Community with relevant information that assists the Air Defender in accomplishing their mission, staying informed and current with ongoing events, as well as issues pertaining to Air and Missile Defense.

16) <u>MCTP Newsletter, 28 January 2013</u>, is published by the Mission Command Training Program (MCTP) in an effort to enhance its mission to conduct or support combined arms training that replicates Joint-Interagency-Intergovernmental-Multinational Operations in a full spectrum Contemporary Operational Environment.

B. Doctrine:

1) Recently Published Doctrine:

a. The ABCT Doctrine Branch would like to announce the publication of **ATP 3-20.15, Tank Platoon, dated 13 Dec 2012**. The ATP can be found on CAC

b. Field Manual (FM) 3-53, Military Information Support Operations, replaces FM 3-05.30, *Psychological Operations*, as the keystone doctrine manual for United States (U.S.) Army Military Information Support Operations (MISO) and MISO forces. This publication serves as the authoritative reference for the U.S. Army in influencing foreign target audiences (TAs) across the range of military operations. The principles contained in this revised publication are linked to higher-level joint doctrine described in Joint Publication (JP) 3-13.2, *Military Information Support Operations*.

c. <u>Field Manual (FM) 3-22, Army Support To Security Cooperation,</u> <u>22 January 2013</u>, provides doctrine for Army support to Department of Defense security cooperation. It explains how Army forces conduct security cooperation, from theater army through brigade level, including support from Headquarters, Department of the Army, functional Army Service component commands, major commands, and direct reporting units. This FM supersedes FM 3-07.1, Security Force Assistance, 01 May 2009.

d. <u>Army Doctrine Update 1-13, 07 January 2013</u>, is published by the United States Combined Arms Center and highlights recent and upcoming changes to doctrine as well as providing information related to doctrine use. This *Doctrine Update* also provides information on the overall Doctrine 2015 strategy.

a. The MSCoE Military Police doctrine team requests your participation in the review for <u>Program Directive (PD) for Army Techniques Publication</u> (ATP) 3-37.2, Antiterrorism, NLT 16 Feb 2013. The revision addresses fundamentals for antiterrorism (AT) operations across the range of military operations and is based on lessons learned from terrorist attacks, wartime engagements, and existing and developing AT strategies and doctrine. ATP 3-37.2 provides operational force commanders, staffs, and AT officers with the tools and expertise needed for AT operations. FM 3-97 provides doctrinal guidance; describes relationships within the SBCT; organizational roles and function; capabilities, limitations, and responsibilities for the SBCT during unified land operations. C. Training:

1) The **TRADOC Capabilities Manager - Armored Brigade Combat Team** (**TCM-ABCT**) offers a monthly update to the ABCT community on recent TCM-ABCT activities and site visits. F. Lessons Learned:

1) From 22 October to 16 November 2012, **1**st **ABCT**, **4**th **Infantry Division executed the second Decisive Action** operations rotation against a high end/near peer threat at the National Training Center. In support of this exercise, **4**th ID deployed a Division TAC to serve as the higher level C2 node, re-blue themselves in the Division level aspects of Decisive Action operations, and formulated TTPs and Division level processes to effectively conduct these types of operations above the Brigade level. On 15 February 2012, in Mazar-e Sharif, Afghanistan, 1-30th Infantry was officially designated as TASK FORCE BALKH, becoming the first mechanized conventional Battalion to effectively serve as a Special Operations Task Force with assigned United States Special Operations Forces (USSOF) Soldiers, Sailors, and Airmen under its command. For the next nine months, the Special Operators, Soldiers, Airmen, Marines, Sailors and Contractors of the Task Force learned while in contact, developing key concepts and ideas for General Purpose Forces (GPF) and Special Operations Forces (SO F) integration.

3) <u>3rd Brigade, 4th Infantry Division SFAT AAR, Team 39, 3-41D</u> (2/205th ANA Security Force Assistance Team (SFAT) End of Tour AAR). The purpose of memorandum is to provide a wide audience of users an after action review of the 2/205 ANA SFAT operations in Zabul Province, Islamic Republic of Afghanistan as part of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM from April – December 2012.
