1. **Purpose:** The intent of this newsletter is to provide ABCT leaders and Soldiers with informational highlights that will be beneficial to their individual, collective, and leader development training efforts as well as highlights on activities occurring throughout the Armored BCT community.

2. Director's Corner:

Greetings to All,

One of the most serious efforts undertaken by our forces in Afghanistan is the attempt to mitigate insider threats/attacks, primarily "green-on-blue" incidents. Since 2007, these attacks continue to increase, as our effort in Security Force Assistance to the ANSF has expanded.

To this end, Department of the Army Intelligence Information Services (DAIIS) has created a SIPR site to consolidate information on "insider threats, green-on-blue" attacks in Afghanistan. This site contains current message traffic (near real time), links, and documents pulled from US and Coalition networks. Other ongoing efforts to mitigate insider threats/attacks include collaboration across multiple training venues with CTCs integrating this threat into scenarios supporting unit rotations. AWG is mentoring units in their Asymmetric Warfare Adaptive Leader Program and lessons learned and best practices are being shared between CF and ANSF. I encourage leaders across the ABCT community to take advantage of the many training enablers available to aid units to mitigate insider threats.

B. **Doctrine:**

- 1) Recently Published Doctrine:
- a. Field Manual (FM) 7-22, Army Physical Readiness Training, October 26, 2012, is the Army's latest version of the physical readiness field manual. This FM provides the training and leader development methodology that forms the foundation for developing competent and confident Soldiers in the conduct of Unified Land Operations.
- b. <u>ATP 3-55.6</u>, <u>Multi-Service Tactics</u>, <u>Techniques</u>, <u>and Procedures for Airborne Target Coordination and Attack Radar Systems</u>, <u>22 August 2012</u>, This publication provides theater- and component-level planners and warfighters procedures for planning, implementing, and executing airborne, manned moving target indicator (MTI) radars in real-time or near-real-time (NRT) targeting support roles as well as procedures to execute airborne command and control (C2), battle management, and wide area surveillance radar operations in support of joint and component operations.
 - 2) Doctrine Under Review:
- a. The USAFCOE DOTD Doctrine Division requests your assistance in reviewing the <u>Initial Draft (ID) FM 3-01, AMD Operations</u>, **NLT 14 December 2012**. This FM is the keystone document for Air Defense. It brings together significant changes in AMD Doctrine concepts, and constructs while focusing on

AMD tactics and procedures for all AMD systems and organizations. It provides doctrinal and operational guidance for commanders and trainers at all echelons. - b. The Mission Command Division, Combined Arms Doctrine Directorate (CADD) requests your assistance in reviewing the **Final Draft (FD)** of **FM 6-99**, **US Army Report and Message Formats**, **NLT 31 December 2012**. This version updates report and message formats currently found in FM 6-99.2, and nests with ADRP 6-0, Mission Command, and FM 6-0, Commander and Staff Organization and Operations (draft) and ADP and ADRP 5-0, The Operations Process. - c. The Capabilities Development Integration Directorate Chaplain Center and School requests your assistance in reviewing Final Drafts (FD) for ATP 1-05.03, Religious Support and External Advisement and FD ATP 1-05.02, Religious Support to Funerals and Memorial Ceremonies and Services. Please submit comments, using the respectively linked matrix for each FD, due NLT 21 December 2012 to usarmy.leavenworth.mccoe.mbx.cadd-org-mailbox@mail.mil or dennis.e.hysom.mil@mail.mil.
- d. The Directorate of Training and Doctrine, MCoE requests your review and feedback on the Final Draft Staffing of FM 3-99, Airborne and Air Assault Operations NLT 07 December 2012. This FM establishes doctrine to govern the activities and performance of Army forces in forcible entry operations and provides the doctrinal basis for vertical envelopment and follow-on operations and provides leaders with descriptive guidance on how Army forces conduct vertical envelopment within the simultaneous combination of offense, defense, and stability. C. **Training:**

- 1) ALARACT 296/2012, Army EXORD 005-13, Revised US Army Forces Command (FORSCOM) Pre-deployment Training Guidance to Mitigate Insider Threats, 22 October 2012, informs all personnel that Insider Threat training is required for every Soldier and every unit deploying to the USCENTCOM AOR.
- 2) The <u>TCM-ABCT BFSB SITREP</u>, <u>05-09 November 2012</u>, offers a monthly update to the ABCT community on recent TCM-ABCT activities and site visits. Noteworthy for November from the Bradley team: Team AMPV completed review of the AMPV STRAP and made comments bringing the document in line with doctrinal changes implemented in ADP 3-0.

3) <u>Army Training Network (ATN)</u> contains training packages which include videos and slides to enable effective training management. It also contains the most current training doctrine available and provides the warfighter the ability to go to one website and seek training solutions. AKO user name and password or CAC access is required.

D. Leadership:

- 1) <u>Leader Net Newsletter, November 2012</u>, is provided for the situational awareness of our leaders.
- 2) NCO Net Update, November 2012, is provided for the situational awareness of our Noncommissioned Officers. Participation on this forum is strongly encouraged as this is a professional forum that benefits all leaders.

E. Lessons Learned:

- 1) HQDA EXORD 102-12, Stand-up of Army Lessons Learned Forum, assigns responsibilities for the Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF LL) and the Army Lessons Learned Forums (AL2F) and provides procedures for developing, collaborating on, and implementing actions to remedy assigned issues. These forums meet weekly to discuss issues pertaining to OEF and Army emerging issues, trends, and observations enabling continuous improvement of Army Forces. - 2) Afghan Culture Understanding, Insights, and Practices: 12-18, contains a collection of previously published articles that focus on Afghan culture and provides insight into effectively communicating with Afghans in order to achieve positive results. More specifically, the articles contained in this newsletter highlight methods to initiate and improve relationships with Afghans, the difficulties and challenges leaders and Soldiers experienced in communicating with Afghans, what worked and did not work, and how to foster and improve meaningful relationships with Afghans to achieve the desired outcome.

1) ALARACT 268/2012, Establishment of Officer Skill Identifier (SI) R7 (Army Reconnaissance) and Enlisted Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) R7 (Army Reconnaissance) establishes Officer SI R7 and Enlisted ASI R7 to identify personnel who have successfully completed the Army Reconnaissance Course at Fort Benning, Ga. and are associated with CMF/Branch 11 (Infantry), 12 (Engineer), 13 (Field Artillery), 15 (Aviation), 19 (Armor) and 35 (Military Intelligence) in grades 2LT-CPT and E6-E8. MOS 12K, MOS 12R AND MOS 12W are exempted.

- 2) ALARACT 309/2012, Cold Weather Injury (CWI) Prevention for 2012-2013 Cold Weather Season, informs Commanders, Supervisors, and Soldiers at all levels of the need to implement protective measures in order to prevent CWI during the 2012-2013 cold weather season.
