2. Director's Corner:

Greetings to All,

The AWfF team will hit the road in November and coming months to garner lessons learned from ABCTs as they conduct decisive action (DA) training rotations at our Combat Training Centers. In addition, we will not lose sight as we continue to send SFAB/SFAT Armored organizations to Afghanistan. We also intend to place emphasis on supporting ABCTs as the Army shifts focus from OEF-A to Regional Alignment and Global Force Management. In December, the team will be in Korea conducting feasibility assessments and gap analysis on 2ID and their MRAP proof of principle. As we move away from a deployment lessons learned focused organization to a DOTMLPF issues and gaps identification based organization, the Combined Arms Center and TRADOC have issued specific doctrine guidance for the Centers of Excellence and the Army as a whole. The AWfF team stands ready to assist your formations in capturing significant gaps in doctrine and training and feeding those back to TRADOC and the Army. To this end, the January symposium will offer a great deal on systemic lessons learned as we gear up to conduct more DA rotations and less mission rehearsal exercises. Additionally, we look forward to hearing your comments on the role and functionality of the reconnaissance squadron in its current configuration. The Armor Center will conduct an R&S capability needs assessment and develop solutions across DOTMLPF for all BCTs. We look forward to their update in January. I think you will find this newsletter filled with relevant information. Of note, I ask that you look at the Doctrine 2015 link we have included. Thank you and as always, please let us know how we can assist you-the Warfighter.

It disseminates professional knowledge about progress, developments and best use in campaigns; cultivates a common understanding of the power, limitations and application of joint Fires, both lethal and nonlethal; fosters joint Fires interdependency among the armed services; and promotes the understanding of and interoperability between the branches, both Active and Reserves.

B. Doctrine:

1) **FY13 Doctrine Guidance**, October 2012, outlines the Combined Arms Center (CAC) Commander's Guidance to the Centers of Excellence and other TRADOC and non-TRADOC doctrinal agencies to follow the TRADOC Commander's doctrine development guidance issued in the Doctrine 2015 Guidance Memorandum, dated 23 August 2011. The CAC Commander also reminds everyone to read and follow the doctrine development guidance per TRADOC Regulation 25-36.

2) The Director, Center for the Army Profession and Ethic (CAPE), request your review, comments, and concurrence with <u>ADRP 1, The Army Profession</u> <u>Initial Draft</u> (ID), NLT 19 November 2012. This new publication for the Army is the only Army-wide staffing planned; **no final draft staffing** will follow this initial draft review cycle. This initial draft has been approved by CG CAC, LTG Perkins and expands on **Chapter 2 of ADP 1, The Army** (Sep 12). This publication defines and doctrinally **describes the Army Profession and the Army Ethic**. All supporting documents and references for this review are available at the above link. 3) The Chief, Army Doctrine Proponency Division, Combined Arms Doctrine Directorate provides the **Doctrine 2015 Update**, **4Q FY12**, **01 October 2012**. This update highlights the publication for all 15 Army Doctrine Publications (ADP) and 13 of 15 Army Doctrine Reference Publications (ADRP). Doctrine 2015 focus will shift to publishing all Doctrine 2015 FMs NLT 31 December 2013.

10) <u>Army Doctrine Update 4-12, 17 October 2012</u>, provides information on the overall Doctrine 2015 Strategy. It builds upon initial guidance contained in the *Doctrine Update*, 3-12, maximizes the understanding of the Doctrine 2015 strategy, and provides timelines of significant publications. Of note on this publication is the change in doctrinal term from Heavy Brigade Combat Team to Armored Brigade Combat Team as rescinded by ADRP 3-90, Offense and Defense, dated 31 August 2012.

11) The Combined Arms Doctrine Directorate, Joint and Multinational Division (JMD) request you review and comment on Initial Draft (ID) of <u>FM 3-16, Army in</u> <u>Multinational Operations, NLT 15 November 2012</u>. C. Training:

1) <u>Army Training Strategy, 03 October 2012</u>, replaces the previous version, dated 04 April 2011. It informs the training strategies and detailed training guidance of subordinate commanders, supervisors, leaders, and trainers of all components in Army Commands, Army Service Component Commands, Direct Reporting Units, the Army Staff, and other activities involved in the planning, programming, preparation, and execution of Army training. It describes how the Army, while continuing the fight in Afghanistan and maintaining a range of global engagements, must simultaneously begin transitioning from a decade focused on counterinsurgency (COIN) operations to a smaller, more versatile Army that will take on a broader range of missions in support of national defense objectives. 2) The <u>TRADOC Capabilities Manager ABCT (TCM-ABCT) and BFSB</u> <u>SITREP, 15 October 2012</u>, offers a monthly update to the ABCT community on recent TCM-ABCT activities and site visits. Noteworthy for October is an information paper on the Precision Gunnery Systems (PGS) written by the TCM-ABCT Bradley Section. This paper highlights the degradation effects created when cannibalization of a system takes place due to lack of steady funding. 3) This month's Afghanistan **Training Community of Interest (TCoI)** took place 17 October 2012. 4) <u>Army Training Network (ATN)</u> contains training packages which include videos and slides to enable effective training management. It also contains the most current training doctrine available and provides the warfighter the ability to go to one website and seek training solutions. 5) The U.S. Army Safety Center published <u>Army CP-12 Explosives Safety</u> <u>Handbook</u> in an effort to provide a vigorous and effective explosives safety program to prevent accidents, incidents, and other events that could harm both the public and DoD personnel, or cause damage to property and the environment. This handbook is intended to enhance effective explosives safety by providing safety professionals the necessary competency to properly carry out their assigned responsibilities and to support the needs of the Army.

6) <u>ALARACT 285/2012, Accountability of Training Aids, Devices,</u> <u>Simulators, and Simulations (TADSS) Within the US Army</u>, directs all Army Organizations in possession of TADSS, not authorized by a Table of Distribution and Allowances, which were not issued to them by their supporting Training Support Center (TSC), to notify their designated TSC IAW AR 5-9. This will enable recording in an Accountable Property System of Record (APSR). TADDS that are authorized by a TDA will be maintained in an APSR at the respective organization level.

1) Latest Warfighter Ammunition Information Program (WAIP) Program Overview, September 2012, and WAIP Endorsement Letter contain key information specifically designed to enhance the operational effects knowledge of troops prior to their deployment and to forge permanent two-way informational conduits that will preserve the PM life cycle management role. Also attached, find the latest issue of AMMO CoP Newsletter, 01 October 2012. 2) <u>ALARACT 289/2012, Factory Treated Army Combat Uniforms with</u> <u>Permethrin (ACU Permethrin)</u>, informs everyone that the Army is introducing a factory treated Permethrin Army Combat Uniform (ACU) known as the ACU Permethrin. Effective February 2013, the ACU Permethrin will replace the current ACU as an Army Clothing bag item. There is no wear-out-date for the non-Permethrin ACUs.

3) **TACOM LCMC Maintenance Information (MI) Message 13-007 Bradley Double Pin Mechanical Track Puller** applies to those Bradley Fighting Vehicle Systems that are fitted with T161 Double Pin Track Assemblies. It advises users to discontinue use of the mechanical puller (PN 10955156) provided as a Basic Issue Item (BII) delivered with the T161 double pin track package. It also instructs to replace the use of the mechanical puller with the temporary established procedures instructing crewmembers how to break and join track for the T161 double pin track.

5) <u>Armor's Asymmetric Advantage - Why a Smaller Army Needs Mobile</u> <u>Protected Firepower</u> by BG Bill Hix, Director, Concept Development and Learning, ARCIC and Mark C. Smith, Military Analyst, Joint and Army Concepts Division was recently published in the October issue of the Armed Forces Journal (<u>www.armedforcesjournal.com</u>). This article provides insight on the importance of maintaining mobile protected firepower in joint and combined operations despite future transitions, force reductions, and other challenges facing the shape of the force.

6) CALL Handbook 12-20, Commander's Guide to Female Engagement Team (FET), V.4, September 2012, is an updated guide for commanders and their staffs, along with female Soldiers interested in or assigned to FETs, on what capabilities FETs bring to the unit. ALARACT 284/2012, Temporary Early Retirement Authority (TERA),

reinstates authorization that allows the Army to offer early retirement to service members who have completed at least 15 years of active service, at a reduced monthly retirement pay, to eligible members prior to completing 20 years of active service.
