#### D. Materiel:

- 1) Army Equipment Modernization Plan 2013 "describes the Research, Development, and Acquisition (RDA) portion of the Fiscal Year 2013 President's Budget request which reflects the Army's priority material programs and identifies the critical capabilities to succeed in the full range of missions while maintaining a decisive advantage over any adversary" (Donald C. Tison, Acting Deputy Chief of Staff, G-8).
- 2) Some units are still trying to make unauthorized modifications to their M16 Rifles and M4 Carbines without a Modification Work Order (MWO). One example is converting an M16 to a squad designated marksman rifle. This is not authorized and could endanger the Soldier, the unit, and the rifle. Refer to TM 9-1005-319-10 and to The <u>Small Arms Integration Book</u> for a list of authorized equipment for mounting on the M16 Rifle and M4 Carbine. - 3) Ammunition Information Notice (AIN) 062-12 is a retransmitted revised Ground Precautionary Action (GPA) Message 12-004. This message informs commanders that the accuracy of XM395 Cartridges could be adversely affected when using M32 Lightweight Handheld Mortar Ballistic Computer (LHMBC) Versions 4.0, 4.0.1, or 4.0.2 software to set XM395 Cartridge parameters when data is corrupted.
