(UNCLASSIFIED//FOR OFFICIAL USE ONLY) In mid-December, 8 INS in possession of an ANSF vehicle were interdicted by ALP/AUP forces. Upon search of the vehicle, 8 suicide vests were found along with grenades and projectile fuzes. Further examination revealed that the ANSF truck itself was configured as a VBIED with explosives hidden under a false bottom in the truck's bed.

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
**AFGHANISTAN REINTEGRATION AND RECONCILIATION PROGRAM**

**Afghanistan Reintegration and Reconciliation Program (APRP)** is a GIROA program which strives to persuade insurgents and low – mid level commanders to lay down their weapons and rejoin their community as peaceful citizens.

The program is conducted in three phases – outreach, demobilization and development.

The APRP is not a pay-off program to entice the insurgent to stop fighting for money. The community becomes the recipient of most of the monetary compensation, in the form of funds for projects.



**Challenges and Best Practices of the APRP**

- Information outreach on the APRP must be presented to a focused and targeted audience. Best practices have determined that radio broadcast has been the most successful method of information dissemination. Other effective methods are aimed at literate Afghans – billboards, leaflets, and other printed articles.
- GIROA will have to take an active part in the process. The program is designed to be focused at the provincial level. Active participation from the Provincial Governors, Peace Councils and Joint Secretariat Teams are required for successful administration of the program. Units can use KLEs to gain leverage of these organizations.
- The program must be sustainable. Community projects must be submitted that will better the community and can be sustained with Afghan processes. Funding, for both project and transition assistance stipend paid to the reintegree must be timely and accurate. If stipend funds aren't provided, the reintegree runs the risk of becoming a recidivist. If no projects are available, the reintegree may return to his former employment.
- Finally, none of the challenges can be overcome without a state of security. In the absence of a secure environment, the potential reintegree will have little motivation to become part of the peace process.

With proper engagement and application of best practices, the endstate of an enduring and fully enabled GIROA program that continues to draw insurgents out of the fight, permanently can be realized.


