- 3) CALL has produced the <u>Final Coordinating DRAFT Afghan CIVCAS</u> <u>Handbook</u> with the intent to eliminate ISAF-caused civilian casualties [CIVCAS] across Afghanistan, and minimize civilian casualties throughout the area of operations. Please share this draft handbook with others in your unit and units in your area of operations to help ensure CALL gets the most feedback possible. This will help CALL to create the best possible product for the Army. CALL is requesting your input and comments NOT LATER THAN 29 May 2012. C. **Training:**

- 1) Army Training Network (ATN) contains training packages which include videos and slides to enable effective training management. It also contains the most current training doctrine available and provides the warfighter the ability to go to one website and seek training solutions. - 2) The **TRADOC Capability Manager-ABCT (TCM-ABCT)** offers a monthly update to the HBCT community on recent TCM-ABCT activities and site visits. Noteworthy for May is a brief provided to BG Thomas James, Jr., Armor Commandant, MCoE on providing future Network capabilities to the Company and Troop XOs. Specifically, Company and Troop level Executive Officers need access to all network capabilities in order to maintain non-interrupted communications with higher, adjacent and internal elements while On the Move (OTM) and in fixed (CO CP) positions (identified in ABCT Formation gap #1). Details are provided in the actual brief available at: **The Networked XO**.

- 3) This month's Afghanistan **Training Community of Interest (TCoI)** took place 23 May 2012. Presentations incuded: "Rule of Law Field Force Justice for Afghanistan" by LTC Jon M. Paladini, National Joint Committee Justice Operations, Rule of Law Field Force- Afghanistan; and "Security Force Assistance Advisor Team (SFAAT) Battlespace Integration" by MSG John Coomer, CJTF-82, G3 Plans Sergeant Major. Download slides at: **TCoI Slides May 2012**. The **next TCoI** will take place **20 June 2012** with tentative topics being "Afghan Mission Network" by IJC CJ6; and "BOS-I Lessons Learned" by IMCOM.
- 4) <u>Mission Command Systems Integration Team (MCSIT)</u> supports the integration of the unit command post as a mission command system (personnel, networks, information systems, processes and procedures, facilities and equipment) to ensure the staff is confident establishing and employing the system to support the commander's decision making. This briefing is presented in an effort to create an expectation among commander's of a resource that is available to them.

D. Materiel:

- 1) Ground Precautionary Action (GPA) Message 12-023 PM HBCT, Vehicle Platform Safety Awareness-Abrams and Bradley, is intended to bring awareness to all units of a recent rise in preventable maneuver training/maintenance accidents. It advises Unit Commanders to implement Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) refresher training (specific to personnel required to operate and maintain the Bradley Fighting Vehicle and Abrams family of vehicles) in order to sustain or regain proficiency. This message also recommends implementation of a dedicated safety stand down day to focus on areas found to have contributed to shortcomings during the previous training cycle. It is recommended that this be performed annually as routine training in addition to immediately following a significant event warranting corrective training to prevent additional incidents.
- 2) Safety Message 000-2012, MRAP All Terrain Vehicle (M-ATV) Vehicles Removal of IBIS-TEK II Tow Bar, directs Commanders to ensure operators and maintenance personnel remove all IBIS-TEK II Tow Bars from M-ATV vehicles and turn them in to Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Disposition Services (formerly DRMO) and to report compliance within 30 days. The IBIS-TEK tow bar is no longer part of the vehicle's BII. Units will use wrecker support to recover disabled vehicles or the approved tow bars (NSN 4910-01-267-2912, NSN 2540-01-434-8595, NSN 2540-01-559-3533 and NSN 2540-01-496-8356) listed on TRADOC's updated Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures (TTP) manual for recovering MRAP vehicles.

- 3) <u>Leader Net Newsletter</u>, **08 May 2012**, is provided for the situational awareness of our leaders.
- 4) "Backbone of the Army" is a Scenario based Video Training Simulator designed to prepare NCOs for life in deployed situations and at home station, working through events and dilemmas that will challenge his/her ideas of what it means to be a leader and a steward of the U.S. Army Profession. These forums meet monthly to discuss issues pertaining to OEF and Army emerging issues, trends, and observations enabling continuous improvement of Army Forces. 1) The FORSCOM Personnel Assessment and Training Team (PERSATT) conducts assessments and training visits primarily to FORSCOM HR formations to ensure they are prepared to deploy and provide essential HR services in support of Commanders, Soldiers, Civilians, and Family members. There is no cost to the command and priority is given to deploying formations within 180 days of LAD. 2) ALARACT 130/2012, Automated Rear Detachment Report (ARDR) and Reporting Requirements, DTG 081616Z May 12. This message supersedes ALARACT 396/2011 and announces implementing instructions for the ARDR which replaces the manual Rear Detachment Report (RDR). Effective 05 June 2012, HQDA G-1 will generate an ARDR on specified active component units. Commanders will ensure

their personnel offices and medical personnel update authoritative systems of record, i.e., eMILPO and MEDPROS, and that they are an accurate reflection of unit readiness, thus ensuring the weekly ARDR generated by HQDA is correct. 3) <u>CSM CSL Board Merger Memorandum</u> from the Army G1 DMPM advises that, effective 01 October 2012, the Army will merge the AC Brigade CSM CSL boards with the AC Battalion CSM CSL Boards.
